13:30	Wat Suthat & The Giant Swing	Visit one of Bangkok's oldest temples. Witness the Giant Swing (Sao Ching Cha) , a historic landmark, and admire the temple's exquisite murals and the large bronze Buddha.
15:00	The Golden Mount (Wat Saket)	Climb the iconic spiral staircase for a 360-degree panoramic view of old Bangkok. Learn about the sacred tradition of wrapping the golden pagoda in red cloth.
17:00	Transfer back to Hotel

Experience a true "Unseen Thailand" moment at Wat Saket (The Golden Mount). Every year during the Loi Krathong festival, locals gather for the sacred tradition of wrapping the massive golden pagoda in a vibrant red cloth. This isn't just for show—it's a powerful act of merit-making and a symbol of protection for the city. If you're in Bangkok, don't miss this sea of red against the skyline!



Wat Borommarachakanchanaphisek Anusorn also known as Wat Leng Noi Yi 2, is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful Chinese temples in Thailand. Its beauty and opulence are said to rival temples in China, with parts reminiscent of the Forbidden City.

Located in Nonthaburi Province, Wat Borommarachakanchanaphisek took over a decade to construct and cost hundreds of millions of baht. It was built to celebrate the 50th anniversary of His Majesty the King's coronation. Not only is the temple massive, but it is also exquisitely decorated, from the wall, floor, and ceiling carvings to the magnificent statues.

It is a large temple with several interconnected buildings, each three or four stories high. One of the most striking structures is the one adorned with 12,000 small Buddha images covering its walls.



Wat Suthat Thepwararam is one of the most significant and oldest temples in Bangkok, Thailand. It's renowned for its striking architectural beauty, grandeur, and the iconic Giant Swing or "Sao Chingcha" situated at its entrance. The temple was commissioned by King Rama I in 1807, with its construction continuing through the reigns of two successive kings. Its name 'Suthat' signifies the 'great model' or 'the model of power', reflecting its historical importance and religious significance.

The temple complex houses a large main chapel, known as 'ubosot,' intricately decorated with hand-painted murals depicting the previous lives of Buddha, making it a masterpiece of Thai artistry. The ubosot enshrines a 13th-century bronze Buddha image brought from Sukhothai by King Rama I. The temple's courtyard is surrounded by a cloister, which contains more than 150 Buddha images, further adding to its spiritual ambiance. The architectural design of Wat Suthat, which blends Ayutthaya and Rattanakosin (Early Bangkok) styles, provides a deep insight into Thailand's rich cultural heritage.

Beyond its religious significance, The Giant Swing at its entrance, a 21.15-meter high teak structure, was once used in an old Brahmin ceremony and is now one of Bangkok's most recognizable landmarks. In 2005, Wat Suthat was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



This ancient Ayutthaya-era temple is a first-class royal temple of the Rajavoramahavihara type. Originally known as Wat Saket, it underwent extensive renovations during the reign of King Chulalongkorn (Rama I), who bestowed upon it the new name Wat Saket. The Golden Mount (Phu Khao Thong) began construction during the reign of King Chulalongkorn (Rama IV), using a model of the Ayutthaya-era Golden Mount, and was completed during the reign of King Chulalongkorn (Rama V). It was given the name Suwannabanpho and stands 77 meters tall. At the summit of Suwannabanpho is a pagoda enshrining relics of the Buddha brought from India. These relics were excavated from an old pagoda hill in the city of Kapilavastu. This pagoda is a sacred site and a symbol of Wat Saket, considered the center of the city. Every year during the Loy Krathong festival, celebrations are held for seven days and seven nights, which has become a tradition of worshipping the Buddha's relics that continues to this day.

This significant site, situated on the only hill in Bangkok, holds immense importance for all Buddhist devotees. 320 steps lead you to the summit for breathtaking views of Rattanakosin Island.
