BACKGROUND

Since the end of the Cold War, humanity has opened up a global era where the world is united across borders with the spread of globalization. For the last 30 years, the international community has enjoyed material enrichment through the establishment of a global supply chain based on mutual cooperation and trust, and we have expected that we could overcome the global crises that threaten human society and lead the infinite prosperity of human society through close coordination.

However, due to the global pandemic of the COVID-19, the vulnerabilities of social structures hidden by the rapid development of material civilization and the loss of human inner values have been exposed to society, and the world has become more prevalent in spirit poverty and ignorance with the decline of morality. As a result, today's peace faces global crises such as our security, livelihood and life-threatening climate, nuclear weapons, and the loss of humanity. In order to overcome these

crises, it is important to restore perfect humanity with the restoration of morality through harmony between spiritual civilization and material civilization.

The leaders and intellectuals who have experienced international turmoil due to the outbreak of COVID-19, have begun to seriously consider the "future of humanity" and are putting the topic of "global citizens" as an important agenda for this purpose. In the human society before COVID-19, the global citizenship education was an option but now it should be a necessity.

To do this, the religious communities need to review the morality and ethics as an international standard to respond jointly and overcome the global crises on the earth according to the spirit of the times, and furthermore build the collective intelligence of global citizens who pursue the harmony of the material civilization and spiritual civilization in order to open the sustainable future of humanity.

Keynote Speech



“After COVID-19: What Should Be the Role of Religion for Global Civil Society?”

Keynote 1 (Day 1, 10:15-10:35)

Venerable Dr. Phra Anil Sakya is Honorary Rector of World Buddhist University and Vice President for Foreign Affairs and Global Engagement of Mahamakut Buddhist University. He was graduated with an M.Phil from Cambridge University and Ph.D. from Brunel University, UK. He has been lecturing and speaking at leading universities, business world, and the UN organizations. He represents the modern face of Theravada Buddhism, a bridge between the monastic’s principled authority and the ever-changing realities of secular existence.

Session Description

Session 1. Peace Dialogue “Recovering Better for an Equitable and Sustainable World”

As we heal from the COVID-19 pandemic, we are inspired to think creatively and collectively about how to help everyone recover better, how to build resilience, and how to transform our world into one that is more equal, more just, equitable, inclusive, sustainable, and healthier. What should we do for an equitable and sustainable world after the pandemic?

Session 2. Knowledge Dialogue “Interfaith Collective Intelligence for One World One Family”

Humanity has continued to make efforts for global peace, but we face to humanitarian crisis due to Pandemics. International cooperation is fragile than before, and people have suffered from poverty, disease, and violence. Can religious teaching be a solution? We will talk about the possibilities of interfaith collective intelligence.

Session 3. Global Dialogue “Responding to Global Consciousness after COVID-19: Global Spirituality and Global Citizenship”

The United Nations declared the Global Citizenship Education Initiative in 2015, emphasizing the importance of global citizenship. Global citizenship is essential to overcome global crises, but in reality, the future of humanity is uncertain due to 'my country first.' Shouldn't the world spirit of our time be global citizenship to overcome the severe crises that threaten humanity?

Session 4. High-level Dialogue “United Nations and United Religions for Global Peace”

The United Nations has contributed to global peace, but its humanitarian peace activities sometimes have been constrained by political considerations. The religious sector has been discussed to establish the United Religions like the United Nations to support ongoing humanitarian activities for global peace. Can the United Religions be a co-partner of the United Nations?

Session 5. Youth Dialogue “Humanity in Crisis and Religious Social Responsibility”

Today peace faces a critical ganger: Global crisis such as climate, nuclear, and humanity emergency, which threatens our security, our livelihoods, and our lives. The crisis is caused by material poverty, the decline of morality, and the poverty and ignorance of the spirit. To overcome such threatens, we must purify the integrity of humanity, develop the power of the spirit.
